

This is the time we have been waiting for - we can participate in the diocesan wide evangelization of our people, beginning with our own selves. 
THE SPIRITUAL LIFE...

... is not, like many people think, for priests or sisters only. Rather, it is for EVERYone. Many people consider themselves "spiritual" - whatever that is that they have in their mind. This can be something from a tree-hugger to someone who likes to watch a sunset, even to being a Satanist can be spiritual. But the true meaning of being a Catholic means, to let the Holy Spirit lead and guide us into transforming us more and more into the likeness of Christ. This spirituality which each one ought to have is not something we pick and chose. But it is by embracing the fullness of the teaching of the Catholic Church. Every last bit of it must be made ours in regards to thinking and living out the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

Priests don't make up these principles, nor can the Holy Father. We are grounded in a 2000 year history, and even going back as far as to the creation of Adam and Eve. GOD has been guiding us all along. From the Old Testament prophets and the priesthood, to the Catechism of the Church and its priesthood in Christ, we are always at the heart and mind of our GOD. There is a great way to transform ourselves from being "me" to "Christ who lives in me" as St. Paul writes (Rom 6:3-4, 8-11), namely: St. Thomas A Kempis' "The Imitation of Christ" would be a great start to begin this transformation. Just to take one chapter each day and try to live it out until the next day brings great blessings. The Rosary ought to be a staple for every Catholic, and so does the reading of Sacred Scripture. It should also be a habit to participate at Holy Masses on Sunday, and if we are able, to attend one or two or three during the week. Every holy Mass we attended during life, will plead for us when we come to the judgment seat of GOD. Then we'd wish we had been more diligent and had overcome our laziness and gotten up earlier for this most noble purpose. And oh yes, silence. For it is in the silence that we hear our good LORD, not in the humdrum and noise of daily life. Also, the daily reading about the saints of the Church gives us some zeal and zest to live this new life.

Anyway, we talked about principles to help us grow in virtue and grace. Here are a few important ones, but by no means all of them:

- To keep GOD in mind at all times.
- To trust in GOD.
- To do all things for the love of GOD.
- Not to trust in oneself.
- Not to seek oneself.



To do all things with joy.
To bring GOD's grace into every aspect of our life.
Bless everyone and anything.
Be thankful to GOD.

Like we said, this is by no means a complete list, but it is a good start. The first point: To keep GOD in mind at all times is of prime importance. Since we are made in the image and likeness of GOD, we are: knowing and loving. And if what we know or study or apply our attention to, we start to love. Sinful things we must hate, no matter if this sin has a nice packaging. If GOD is at center of our thoughts, we will learn "to love Him with out whole heart, mind, soul and body" (Deut 6:4-9).

Since this is probably the most difficult to do at the beginning, we might have to force ourselves to do this. A most wonderful help comes from GOD Himself. Come daily into the presence of GOD, and spend some time with Him. Start with 1/2 hour and work your way to to an hour and even longer. It will take discipline to do this. But once we experience the sweetness that comes from being with GOD who waits for us in the Tabernacle, we would not want to miss it. Can one describe the sweetness of this colloquy of heart to heart? In one word - PEACE - profound peace, of mind and heart. Bishop Sheen said once that all his life, he never missed this "holy hour," neither did Mother Theresa. They were spiritual giants and we must learn from them. What GOD has done with them, He also wants to do with us. GOD knocks at the door: toc, toc, toc,... do we listen or will we even press the block button on Jesus?

And something even beginners can do to change themselves (for most of us for the better) - we can fast one day a week. Maybe an outright fasting would be too much for most, but let's start with one day of bread and water. Can we let go of all the good things we stuff ourselves with for one day? To remind us of what Jesus said: "these demons can only be driven out by prayer and fasting!" (Mt 17:21)

To conclude: to love GOD is a most wonderful and noble task. EVERYONE, every single person is called (= vocation) to this knowing and loving of GOD. And once we are in love, it is just a matter of time before this lover flows over into our words and actions, we become a true disciple of Christ. What the heck, we have tried so many other things, let us give this spiritual life "a go."
