From the **DESK** of... **FR. PETER**

THE NEED TO POSSESS

There is something about human beings who want to possess things. Don't believe me? Just open your garage door and be amazed!

This is true for physical things, many also want to have a family - and a spouse and a bunch of children is the result. Some want honor and money and what not - they all work towards their goal in life and many will achieve it. And yet, that heart is still not happy? How come?

Looking at physical things - if we possess them and don't share, we will never derive happiness from them. If we take a spouse to satisfy my desire, rather than to be of service to others, that family becomes a war zone. To want fame, money, and what not, it will possess us and will destroy us. Same thing goes for GOD! To possess GOD we just cannot take Him and make Him mine. It is a free gift from GOD that He comes to us. Once He has made a home within us, we cannot just relax and say: "now I am all set, I don't need anything else!" For to truly possess the LORD, we must study up, we must pray, we must learn to lay down our lives for our GOD and for our neighbor. In other words, I become an instrument of service, rather than the "owner" of GOD. It seems like a dichotomy - but it 'ain't.' Does not GOD serve us day and night, even when we don't think about Him, He thinks about us and every moment of our lives He sends us His grace, He serves us, if only we want to accept His love - which is a total and free giving of SELF to another.

HOLY ROSARY

By 1615, a mere 66 years after the Faith was first brought to the islands, there were 400,000 Catholics in Japan. It was then that Japan's rulers turned against them. All missionaries were expelled or martyred. Thousands of Japanese faithful won the never-fading crown of martyrdom. Thereafter, since there were no priests, remaining Catholics had but two sacraments available to them: Baptism (which can be administered in time of emergency by anyone having the use of reason) and Holy Matrimony (which is administered by the couple themselves).

In 1859, missionaries were finally allowed to return. One of the first to arrive was Pere Petitjean. He received a great consolation and surprise on March 17, 1865. That was the date several Japanese approached him with three questions. They asked them to determine whether he was a true Catholic priest and not a spy sent to trick them out of hiding. The first was whether he was married (they had learned from their fathers that Catholic priests do not marry). They then asked whether he was at peace with the pope. The last question: "Where is your Rosary?" When he produced the required article, he was told the incredible story of how Japanese Catholics had preserved their faith all those years. There were about 50,000 of them at the time.

CODE OF CANON LAW - MARRIAGE 13

Certitude of Valid and Licit Celebration


**Canon 1066 - Before marriage is celebrated it must be evident that nothing stands in the way of its valid and licit celebration.**



This canon is situated between those which deal with a basic readiness for marriage and those directly concerned with freedom to marry. Directly related to canon 1066 are canons 1058 (the right to marry) is contingent on fulfilling certain legal prerequisites.

The canon enunciates a basic fact about marriage. It states that a wedding cannot take place unless the pastoral minister is morally certain that it will be valid and licit. Practically speaking, this type of certitude means that there is no reason to believe that the marriage would be invalid or at least illicit. Knowingly to permit or witness a wedding if one is aware of the presence of a diriment impediment or other invalidating factor is to permit an invalid marriage. This same obligation was contained in the 1917 Code (CIC 1019, §). Nevertheless, it appears to have been rarely invoked due to the difficulties involved in determining when a proposed marriage would certainly be invalid."

The pastoral minister must arrive at this certainty by means of positive and morally certain arguments and not mere conjecture, hypothesis, or negative arguments. In short, all prudent doubt that the union would be invalid must be removed.



This canon is concerned not only with impediments which may be present but with any factor which would render the marriage invalid or illicit. With reference to invalidity, of particular importance are the many invalidating factors arrived at by developing matrimonial jurisprudence. One might note the various kinds of emotional and psychological disorders, rejection of the Catholic concept of marriage, and seriously inadequate consent which reflects a desire for a wedding but does not include true marriage.

When the pastor applies this canon, he must objectively study the facts of the case. The parties have a right to a thorough, unbiased investigation of their readiness for marriage grounded in their fundamental right to marriage as well as their right to adequate pastoral care (c. 213). If the pastoral minister is certain of invalidating factors such as the outright rejection of children, fidelity, or perpetuity or the presence of an impediment or serious psychological disorder,

he may not witness the union. If he has serious doubts about the union, the prudent approach would be to consult the local ordinary out of respect for the parties' rights. The local ordinary could in turn invoke canon 1066 and study the matter and perhaps prohibit the marriage temporarily.
